LOW DOSE CT REPORT - ABDOMEN AND PELVIS (PLAIN AND CONTRAST)

TECHNIQUE: Volume scan of whole abdomen was made from xiphisternum to pubis before and after administration of 60 ml of non-ionic intravenous contrast. Plain scan was followed by arterial and hepatic venous scans. MPR & SSD / VR images were obtained. Post contrast images. No allergic reactions Observed.

OBSERVATION:

Liver is mild increased in size apporx 17cm and shows uniform decreased density. No focal lesion is seen. No abnormal enhancement is seen. The intrahepatic biliary radicles are normal. Portal and hepatic veins are normal. CBD is not dilated.

Gall Bladder - normal

Pancreas is normal in size and density. No calcification, mass or peripancreatic fluid collection seen. The pancreatic duct is not dilated.

Spleen is normal in size and density.

Right kidney is normal in size. Pelvicalyceal system not dilated.

Ureter is not dilated. No radiodense calculus is seen. The vesico-ureteric junction appears normal.

It shows normal enhancement in Cortico-medullary and nephrogram phases.

Left kidney is normal in size. Pelvicalyceal system not dilated.

Ureter is not dilated. No radiodense calculus is seen. The vesico-ureteric junction appears normal.

It shows normal enhancement in Cortico-medullary and nephrogram phases.

Both adrenals appear normal in size and shape.

There is no mass or significant lymphadenopathy seen in the retroperitoneum.

No free fluid is seen in the peritoneal cavity.

No obvious bowel wall thickening / dilatation seen.

No significant abnormality seen in right iliac fossa.

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The **bladder** is normal. No evidence of diverticulum or calculus.

Prostate appears normal for the age.

No lytic or sclerotic lesion is seen in visualized bones.

Defect noted in umbilical region neck 10mm with omentum as content

IMPRESSION:

Hepatomegaly with fatty infiltration of liver
small umbilical hernia

Limitation of computer tomography:

- 20% of gall bladder stones is not visualized on CT.
